# **Hockey Scoro Insurance**

#### **Insurance Product Information Document**

#### WHAT IS THIS TYPE OF INSURANCE?

Hockey Scoro is a form of prize insurance designed to indemnify a prize should a Participant shoot the puck from center ice or the far blue line through a target hole in the net.



### What Is insured?

- To complete a successful Hockey Scoro the Participant(s) must shoot a puck from the specified distance directly through the target hole of the net.
- Prizes from \$5,000 to \$1,000,000 are available.
- Coverage can be purchased for single games or a whole season.



### Are there any restrictions on the cover?

- Participants must not be aware they are taking a shot until a maximum of 24 hours before the event.
- Participant(s) shall not be permitted any shots, including practice, or warm-up, nor shall any one participant be selected to participate on more than one occasion covered by this contract. Failure or disregard of any of the above shall render this contract null and void and no prize award shall be awarded.
- In the event that the puck passes completely through the target hole (3.25 inches wide), the shot shall be considered made and therefore eligible to be counted as a successful attempt towards a reimbursable prize. The puck MUST travel directly from the Participant(s) at the specified distance(s) and pass completely through the target hole without first bouncing or making contact with any other physical apparatus/materials, other than the template.

- The following classes of people shall be ineligible to participate in the event:
  - Current or former professional hockey players;
  - Current or former collegiate/university varsity hockey players who have played at that level in the past five (5) years;
  - Current or former Junior "A" (Major or Minor), "B", or "C" players who have played at that level in the past five (5) years;
  - Current or former provincial or national team players who have played at that level in the past five (5) years.
- No blocking or grooving of the ice shall be permitted.
- No part of the contestant's body or clothing may come in contact with the demarcation line(s) prior to releasing the hockey puck.



### Where am I covered?

• Coverage is available globally including Canada and the United States.



## What are my obligations?

- The Insured must specify the distance of 90 feet from the net (center ice red line), or
   120 feet from the net (far blue line) for all insured attempts.
- The Insured must be aware of all Terms & Conditions, ensuring the event is conducted in accordance with the policy.
- All attempts must be video recorded. Video record of each attempt must be
  continuous play, without any breaks. Each attempt must be recorded at an angle,
  which would clearly show the Participant taking the shot, the path of the puck, and
  the puck going through the provided target. Failure to follow video recording
  instructions shall render any claim hereunder forfeit.
